

REMOVING BARRIERS TO PRACTICE AND CARE

Recommendation 1: Build Common Ground Around Scope of Practice and Other Issues in Policy and Practice.



APRN SCOPE OF PRACTICE HAWAI`I LEGISLATION

2009

Act 126

- APRNs are PCPS
- Global signature authority.

2010

Act 57

- Clarified the scopes of practice for APRNs.

2011

Act 110

- Full prescriptive authority including prescribing controlled drugs (Schedule II-V),
- Allowed APRNs to dispense manufacturers' medication samples

2013

- ACT 232 APRN care for mental health and substance abuse
- ACT 250 APRN may treat STIs without prior medical eval

2014

- ACT 45 Updates obsolete HRS
- ACT 159 APRN reimbursement for telehealth
- ACT 154 APRNs included in signature authority for POLST

2015

Act 27


- APRN roles relating to emergency hospital admission and involuntary hospitalization

2016

- ACT 18 Allows HBON to fully utilize NURYSY
- ACT 92 Repeals Joint Formulary Advisory Committee
- ACT 97 Allows BON to conduct criminal background checks on nurse licensees upon application and renewal
- ACT 183 Removes additional barriers to practice
- ACT 230 Allows APRNs to certify patients for Medical Marijuana use







§457-9.2 CONTINUING COMPETENCY REQUIREMENTS; EXEMPTIONS; EXTENSIONS; RECORDS RETENTION; AUDIT.

(a) Beginning July 1, 2017, with the renewal of the licensing biennium, and every biennial renewal thereafter, each registered nurse and practical nurse licensee shall have completed one of the learning activity options recognized by the board within the two-year period preceding the renewal date, in addition to the requirements of section 457-9.






