Policy Update Brianne Atwood for Laura Reichhardt	Brianne Atwood provided a presentation on the Policy Updates, on Laura Reichhardts behalf. A summary of the presentation and discussion is included herein.	None
	Proposed Bills by the Center	
	Relating to Healthcare Recruitment and Retention (Bill).	
	 Amends the definition of "preceptor" and "volunteer-based supervised clinical training rotation" to improve accessibility for providers to receive income tax credits for acting as preceptors. 	
	 Include the director of health on the preceptor credit assurance committee. 	
	 Amends the criteria for certificate of need review to including the relationship to the existing health care system of the area. 	
	o Effective upon approval.	
	 The goal of this bill is to enable the Tax Credit program to be more effective. DOH and DoTAX has been apprised of this bill and is supportive of the contents though DOH is not introducing this bill as they are prioritizing DOH budget and COVID bills. 	
	Related to Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (Bill).	
	 Amends various statutes to clarify the role of advanced practice registered nurses with regards to their authority and participation in the health care system. 	
	 Amends definitions in the statutes to conform with the duties and responsibilities of advanced practice registered nurses. 	
	o Effective upon approval.	
	 The Hawai'i APRN Removing Barriers to Practice Task Force members identified three categories in the Hawaii Revised Statutes which relate to APRN's ability in determining capacity, disability, or fitness to proceed and have contributed to practice barriers for APRNs. 	
	 HSCN will route these bills to DOH, DoTax, and the Deputy AG for the Health and Human Services Division for advanced notice and comment before seeking drafting and introduction. 	
	Bills Supporting: Related to Recruitment and Retention of Nurses	
	• Relating To Loan Repayment For Health Care Professionals. (Bill)	
	 Reintroduces <u>SB2983</u> which provides matching funds for the Hawai'i State Loan Repayment program for healthcare professionals who work in federally-designated health professional shortage areas. 	
	 Loan repayment improves retention of APRNs by reducing financial barriers to remaining in Hawai'i. 	
	 Without state-match funding, the state is at risk of losing the Federal grant.

	Relating to Health Care (Bill).	
	 Scope of Practice 	
	 Amends "Intentional termination of pregnancy; penalties; refusal to perform" in Ch 453 to add term "licensed qualified health care provider" which included APRNs, and amends Ch 457, Nurse Practice Act, to permit APRNs to perform abortion. 	
	 HSCN plans to provide comments as it relates to education, training, and scope of practice for the sections pertaining to APRNS only. 	
	Relating to Health (Bill).	
	 Scope of Practice 	
	Amends Section 327L-1 to explicitly recognize advanced practice registered nurses as attending providers and consulting providers capable of performing all necessary duties under the Our Care, Our Choice Act in accordance with their scope of practice and prescribing authority. Reduces the mandatory waiting period between oral requests made by a terminally ill individual from twenty to fifteen days.	
	 HSCN plans to provide comments as it relates to education, training, and scope of practice for the sections pertaining to APRNS only. 	
	Bills to Monitor:	
	Licensure of Midwives (Bill).	
	 Reintroduce 2020 bill <u>SB2428</u> which amends various provisions related to the licensure of midwives. Allows certified nurse midwives and direct-entry midwives to refer to themselves as "midwives". Allows a traditional midwife to practice midwifery under certain conditions. Repeals the repeal date for chapter 457J, Hawaii Revised Statutes. HSCN plans to monitor as it exempts APRN CNM from proposed regulation and no impact for CNM practice is identified at this time. 	
	Other bills will be introduced and reviewed upon introduction during the legislative session. Bills are historically introduced the 3 rd Wednesday through the last day of January.

Research Update Carrie Oliveira	Carrie Oliveira provided a presentation on the HSCN Research. A summary of the presentation and discussion is included herein. Key Findings from the 2018-2019 Hawai'i Nurse Education Capacity Report Study Background • Purpose: assess capacity of Hawai'i's schools of nursing to educate nurses needed to sustain the workforce. • Study Period: spring semester of the next AY • 2018-2019 study was conducted between February & May 2020	None
	 Impacts of COVID: Extended fielding period by 2.5 months Every in-state school submitted a completed survey; Missing some demos for LPN & ADN students and faculty 	
	 2020 Report Released on 30/30/2020 Major sections include; Overview of nurse education, Pre-license programs, Post-license programs, Employment prospects, Faculty characteristics, Schools' challenges & their responses. 	
	 Key findings Pre-license programs Enrollment demand exceeded capacity for all program types. BSN programs have greatest demand. New enrollments increased by 3% as compared to AY 17-18. Number of new graduates increased by 20% over AY 17-18. Post-license programs Less demand and competition exists for post-license programs than pre-license programs. New enrollments, total census, and graduations decreased vs. AY 2017-2018. For all except DNP. Declining enrollment in BSN programs is contributing to a slower, flatter trajectory toward 80% BSN preparedness. New Grad RN Employment Prospects: 90% of graduates from 2015-2018 reported residing in Hawai'i. No major differences on most job-related variables. Hawai'i RNs are less likely to work in hospitals and more likely to work in LTC. Faculty 	

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	 Faculty composition has shifted from being mostly FT to mostly PT positions. Lack of funding for faculty compensation is a top challenge. Smaller clinical cohorts equal more clinical faculty. Unknown impact on overall instructional capacity. 	
	 Looking Ahead Schools will get comparison reports. Next year's study should include new demand data from HAH. Partners and Research Steering Committee will help to shape the discussion for maximum relevance and impact.

	Perspectives & Experiences: COVID-19 & the Community	
	"What are the needs, concerns and experiences of COVID? Lessons learned, Success stories or other issues?" • Food insecurity and resource isolation in the community. • Member participation in COVID-19 contact tracing courses. • UH/DOH contact tracing courses were well structured and invaluable. • The challenges involved in Provider/Facility contact tracing and the need for consideration of new details. • Managing facility/provider staff exposures. • Nursing shortages and COVID related gaps in coverage. • Fear and fatigue among frontline nurses and the need to find ways to support nurses to prevent burnout. • Using prediction models for surge planning. • Concerns for the statewide financial impact of COVID and the negative impact on our healthcare facilities • Concerns for the long term impacts on the workforce due to nonessential workforce cuts. • COVID training for home health professionals , including PPE preparation. • Challenges related to staffing home health for COVID positive patients. • Partnerships and collaboration within the community, particularly for home health and hospice care have been strengthened in response to COVID-19 challenges. • PPE shortages, particularly certain sizes have been in short supply. • Recognition of Healthcare Association of Hawaii and HIEMA support. • Challenges of COVID in long-term care/VA on Hawaii Island. • Aggressive treatment of COVID-19 patients is seeing positive results on Hawaii Island. • COVID positivity among friends and family.
