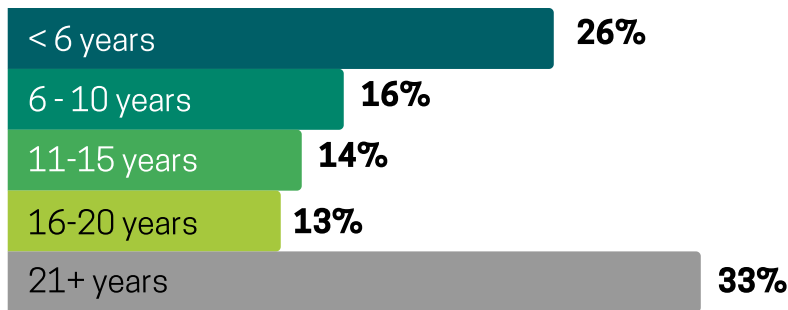

- Baccalaureate Degree - **18%**

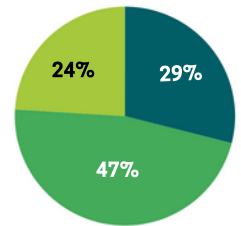

9% of licensed practical nurses are male.

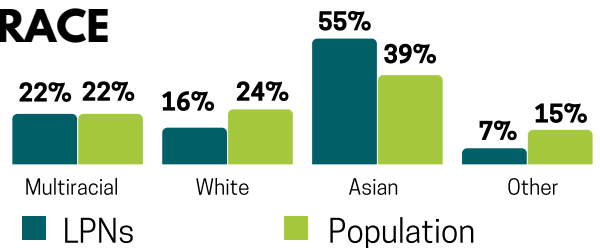

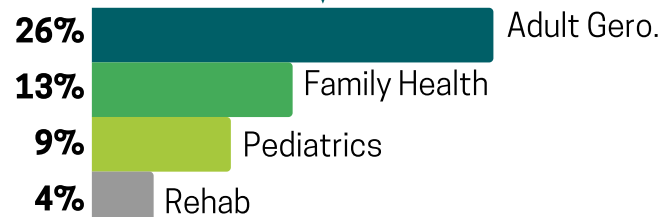
10% of LPNs plan to retire in the next five years.

RACE

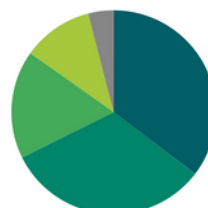


15% report having Native Hawaiian ancestry.
