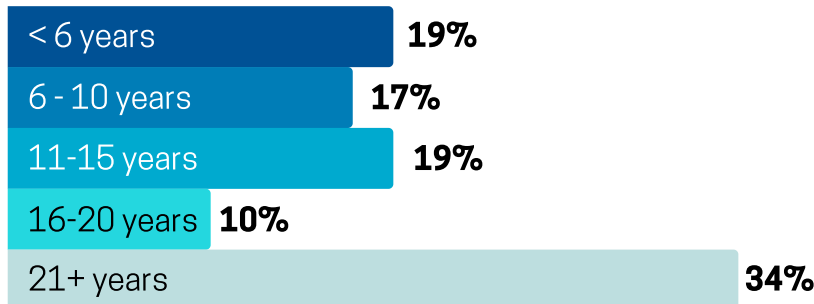

EDUCATION

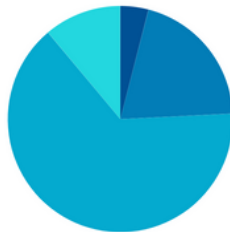


54% of RNs were educated in the state of Hawaii.

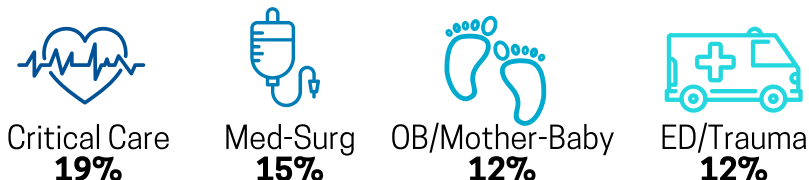
7% of RNs are enrolled in a nursing degree-leading program.

TOP RN CERTIFICATIONS



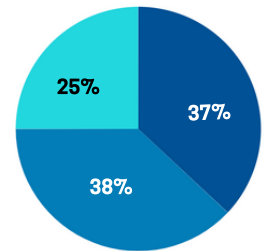
DEMOGRAPHICS



12% of registered nurses are male.

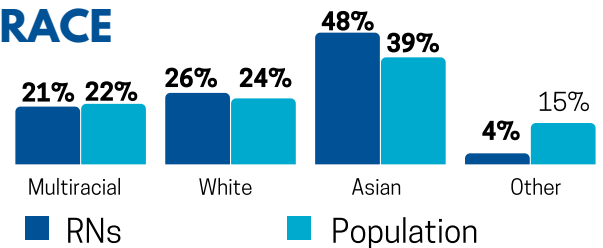

- Baby Boomer (57 - 75)



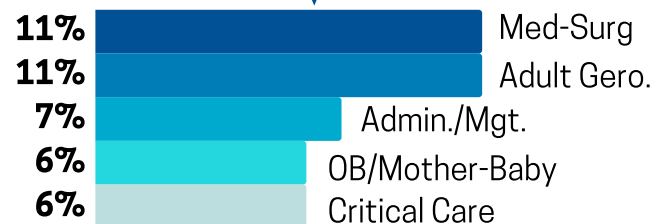
16% of RNs plan to retire in the next five years.
