

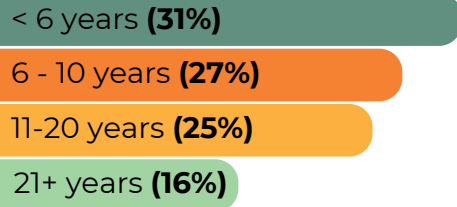
ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES (APRNs) 2023 HAWAII NURSING WORKFORCE SUPPLY

APRNs are RNs who have advanced education, training, and certification. They care for patients by assessing health conditions, diagnosing illnesses, and providing treatments which may include prescribing medication and referring to specialists.

OF YEARS LICENSED



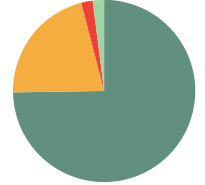
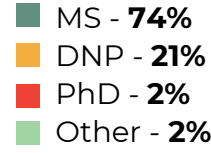
87% of APRNs have **prescriptive authority**.

90% of APRNs feel that nursing is a **fulfilling career**.

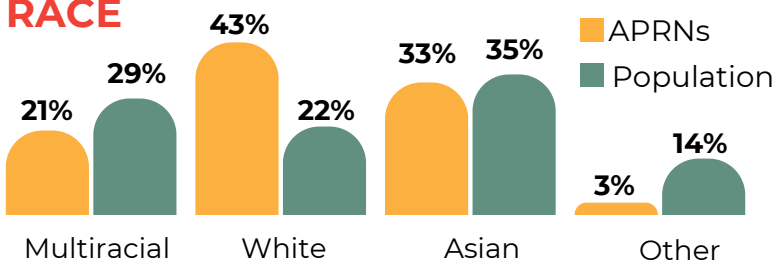


1 in 4 APRNs have researched/obtained **mental healthcare** to cope with work-related stress.



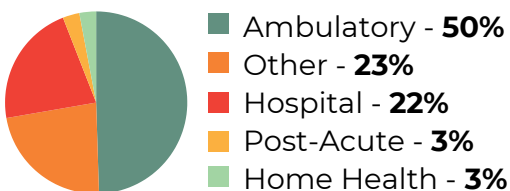
16% of APRNs plan to **retire** in the next 5 years.

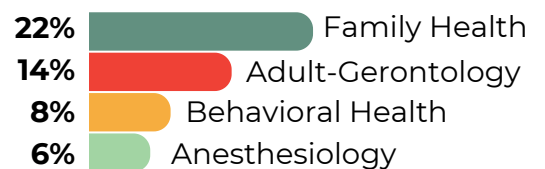
55% of APRNs are **primary care** providers.
